MINUTES OF JORDANS PICTURE HOUSE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD AT 8PM ON FRIDAY MAY 13th 2022 IN JORDANS VILLAGE HALL

1. Introduction

Alan Sealy, Chairman of Jordans Picture House welcomed the 'sell-out' audience of some 50+ enthusiastic Members and supporters.

2. Reports

Alan Sealy presented the Committee Report for our sixth Season, September 2021-May 2022 and confirmed our increasing membership (currently 96 members). This was followed by the Financial Report from Chris Waymouth. These received overwhelming approval by show of hands.

Lorraine Bristow talked briefly on the success of Front of House activities.

3. Rule amendment

Alan then explained the proposed Amendment to Rule 3 (ii) re committee members' term of office, changing this from a maximum 3 two-year terms to a maximum of 3 three-year terms. This was approved by a show of hands.

4. Film selection for 2022-23 season

5. Better Connected Beaconsfield

Alan then announced that to this end we would be sponsoring a special screening of 'Mr Jones' a recent film of the story of the appalling Soviet 'engineered' famine in Ukraine in the 1930s. The film is to be screened on June 18th at the NFTS Beaconsfield.
